Delineation of the large heterozygous 4qTer deletion. (a) Systematic screening of heterozygous rearrangements at the *F11* locus by QFM-PCR. The QFM-PCR electropherogram of patient XXIV/41 is overlaid with that of a normal control following normalization against the reference diploid *F2* amplicon located on chromosome 11 (Ref). Another control amplicon located in the *F9* gene on chromosome X (control) was used to validate the quantitative analysis by determining the sex based on chromosome X dosage. All peaks corresponding to sequences in the *F11* gene show a two-fold reduction (horizontal bars) of their height, indicating a heterozygous deletion of the whole gene. (b) The large deletion of 4qTer revealed by arrayCGH. The log<sub>2</sub> of the Cy3/Cy5 fluorescence intensity ratio is plotted against the chromosome 4 nucleotide position (hg18). Grey dots indicate copy number losses (log2 ratio~-1), while the black dots indicate no copy number change. More than 7 Mb of sequences are involved in this deletion, and the *F11* gene (outlined in red) is located in the middle.
