


Phospholipase D regulates the size of skeletal muscle cells through the activation of mTOR signaling

Additional file 2. Effects of various agents on the phosphorylation of mTORC1 substrate S6K1 and mTORC2 substrate Akt.

(A) Myotubes were treated for 2 days with 0.1% 1-butanol or 0.1% t-Butanol as a control. (B) Myotubes were left untreated, or treated for 2 days with 50 μ M or 100 μ M dexamethasone. (C) Myotubes were transfected for 2 days with control siRNA (si-C), or siRNA directed against Raptor (si-Rapt), or Rictor (si-Rict). Phospho-Thr389/412-S6K1, total S6K1, Ph-Ser473-Akt, total Akt, were then detected by immunoblotting.
